



Measurement lesson 2

We are learning to measure using non-standard units

-Choose something you have at least 2 of and are the same e.g, hands, feet, pieces of Lego, cubes, pencils.

-Start at the bottom of the item

-Make sure you place the units next to each other

-Count how many you needed to measure the item


Directions- Pick a nonstandard measurement tool to estimate and measure five objects in our classroom. Show your work below.

What you see on the top is only a part of it? 90% of an iceberg is actually underwater.</p>	<p>Did you know there are Christian churches in Antarctica? Can you find out how many there are?</p>
<p>Explorers had to bring their own food to Antarctica. Do you remember how the bread went mouldy in our classroom? Explorers need to bring food that will last a long time without going bad. Did you know that because the world is slowly getting warmer Antarctica is slowly melting? What ways can we stop climate change? Here are two videos which might help Video 1 Video 2</p>	<p>Did you know that scientists have found volcanoes in Antarctica? Yes! 91 of them! Mount Erebus is one of the most active Volcanoes are very hot. What happens to ice when it melts? Try holding an ice-cube in your hand what does it turn into? What do you think will happen if the volcanoes erupt?</p>	<p>What sports or games are played on our continent? Did you know you can run a marathon in Antarctica? But that's not the only game played in Antarctica. Scientists have to spend a lot of time inside when the weather is bad outside. A bit like lockdown! Pick a game you can play inside. Can you write instructions how to play it?</p>
<p>Look at Antarctica on Google Maps or Google Earth. Draw a map of Antarctica and add on where the south pole is. This image might help</p>	<p>Did you know that lots of the buildings in Antarctica are on 'legs' to make sure they don't get stuck if lots of snow falls. Can you make a model of a building on legs? Try using Lego, playdough or cardboard.</p>	<p>Did you know no one lives on Antarctica all the time? Scientists from all over the world visit to do experiments. Learn to say hello in 3 new languages, so you can say hi to other scientists if you ever visit.</p>	<p>Last Year Primary 2 emailed a scientist called David Sugden who had actually been to Antarctica (15 times!) and we asked him some questions. You can read his answers by clicking here Can you think of 3 things you want to know about Antarctica that we could ask him?</p>
